

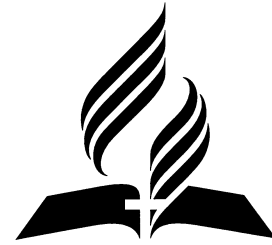
Pastor's Corner
