

Pastor's Corner

Revelation 12:15-16 reads like this: “So the serpent spewed water out of his mouth like a flood after the woman, that he might cause her to be carried away by the flood. But the earth helped the woman, and the earth opened its mouth and swallowed up the flood which the dragon had spewed out of his mouth.”

Here we have a depiction of the war on the church during the Dark Ages. We know this based on the timeline referenced in vs. 14 of this chapter. In chapter 12 we see the dragon, who is Satan, making war with the Lamb, who is Christ, who after ascending into heaven left to His church (the woman) the responsibility of carrying forth His work. Thus His church faces the onslaught of Satan's fury. In vs. 15 & 16 we see Him attacking the church with a flood, which as Rev. 17:15 points out, represents people. When we look at history, we see a major battle both from outside and inside the church, demonstrating Satan's approach. As we contemplate the stories and atrocities that took place in what we know as the Dark Ages, we realize that Satan's most effective approach was the work he did through the people inside the church.

When we consider the last verse of Revelation chapter 12 we note Satan's future plans relative to the end of the Dark Ages. Verse 17 reads: “And the dragon was enraged with the woman, and he went to make war with the rest of her offspring, who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ.” As we noted at church a few weeks ago, here we find our identity; in chapter 10 we find our story and mission. Yes, as a remnant people, we have known persecution, trials, and disappointments all of which have driven us to our knees in prayer and to the careful study of God's Word. Today, with all the conveniences of the 21st century, with the lack of persecution in our home land, with the affluence of many Adventists, we find ourselves in a very vulnerable position in relation to the enemy.

Today as we continue our “Sunset” series on end time events, let us be clear that this history of the four horsemen is not merely behind us, but their story continues on to our day, thus making it relevant for you and me. May we realize our vulnerable state and like those who went before us, fall to our knees in prayer and enter into a more careful and thoughtful study of God's Word.

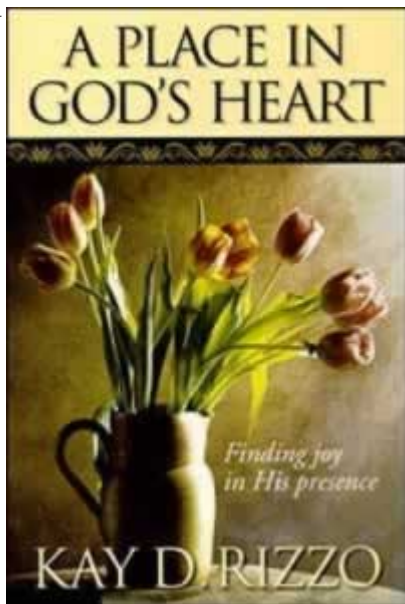

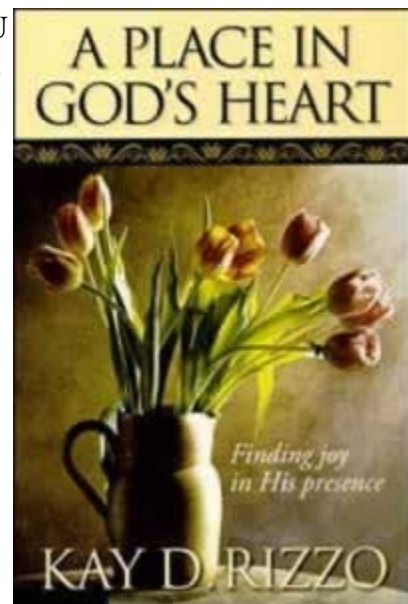
